ROADMAP TO RENEWAL

From the Pastor

IS THERE ROOM FOR MARY'S SON?

It is reasonable to assume the inn was full. Even if there was no sign that said "no vacancy" the word still was out that there was no room. But consider this. What if the word was what many others hear: We don't want your kind here; Why don't you go back where you came from?; Wouldn't you be more comfortable with your own kind of folks? Too often it seems the world waits for the "right kind of people." Signs or attitudes say to those who do not fit the mold – we don't want your kind here. No place for them – that was the word when Jesus made his entrance. Was it crowded conditions or exclusive attitudes. The dynamics are often the same. Throughout his life Jesus encountered both.

The word throughout Jesus' life was NO PLACE – NO ROOM. Herod the King, who was insecure in what he represented, had no place in his world for a baby who might bring in a new order. When Jesus proclaimed good news for the oppressed in his hometown of Nazareth, the word was NO ROOM – LEAVE NOW. The story repeated itself throughout his ministry

and his teaching. In the end people plotted to kill him – because there was no room for what he represented. In the final week in Jerusalem, the Holy City at a holy time, the message was NO ROOM – except on a cross outside the city gates. Even the grave in which his body was placed could not contain him.

The question keeps coming at us – IS THERE ROOM FOR MARY'S SON? It comes because there are those to whom the world says there is "no place" or "no time" for you. They are still labeled, as they were in Jesus' day – outcast, sinner, intruder, prisoner. Some are prisoners not behind bars, but behind walls of hunger, poverty, fear, or exclusive attitudes. If there "is no room for these is there room for Mary's son – who said "Inasmuch as you have done it unto the least of these, you have done it unto me?"

The Advent/Christmas message is still with us. Christ comes – still seeking to find room in our world, in our lives, and in our hearts. In each of these places the question remains: "Is there room for Mary's Son?"

A hymn that was close to my heart when I was growing up includes the words "Come into my heart, Lord Jesus, there's room in my heart for you." It is yet an appropriate prayer in the Advent Season. We will sing in

this season "Let every heart prepare him room." However, that chorus is not limited to this season.

But know this – He's not coming alone – He's bringing some friends. How big is your heart?

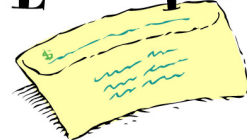

works with the flow of the service. The recording itself is very simple and is done without tapes or CD's – there are no complicated rewinds or cues to hit. The recording that is made serves as a feed to the radio station as well as the file for the audio that is posted to our website.

If we cannot be successful in creating a team to assist in the pressing of the “record” and “playback” buttons, the church will soon have to make a determination of the value of the radio ministry to the community and the church. Our success or failure here will also need to be considered as the church considers the use of video during worship, since video presentations are far more time-consuming and complex than what we need here.
