## FROM THE PASTOR

*In so many ways, the time of year reminds us of what has been. We go back to school, perhaps the greatest reminder. The leaves are changing colors and falling to the ground. The weather is changing and getting cooler, soon colder. We have some preconceived notions of what the fall means as the time when, with summer over, it's time to get back to work again!*

*We who are followers of Jesus Christ know that the fall means a new round of Sunday School is starting. And somehow that translates into feeling like a new season of focus is getting underway. That focus may be different for each of us, but is also similar insofar as our congregational family is concerned. The summer is over!*

*Three different missionary journeys taking the Apostle Paul to various places around the Mediterranean gave him a sense, too, of things like they had been. Each time he was getting back to the same work he had been doing. The great difference is that he didn't take the summer off. Rather his journeys were often interrupted by time in jail. The work Paul was doing made people mad mostly because he was preaching a gospel message that was contrary to, or at least different from, what people were thinking at the time. During the 2<sup>nd</sup> missionary journey*

*Paul stopped in Philippi, a Roman colony in the province of Macedonia, and started a church with some people with whom he became very close. His letter to the Philippians, written somewhere around the year 60 CE and from a prison cell, recognizes much good ministry. The letter also sounds an alarm about the Philippians propensity for following others who teach a modified gospel and calls them back to what they know to be correct.*

*Paul writes in chapter 2 beginning at verse 12:*

*Therefore, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed me, not only in my presence, but much more now in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for it is God who is at work in you, enabling you both to will and to work for his good pleasure.*

*Do all things without murmuring and arguing, so that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, in which you shine like stars in the world.*

*The reference "crooked and perverse generation" harkens all the way back to Deuteronomy and degenerate children dealing falsely with a perfect and just God. And the phrase shining like stars comes from the same expression as the line in Matthew that says, "You are the light of the world." You see, Paul is setting landmarks along the way as he calls people back to the gospel message. These*

landmarks are such that we understand the call not to a hollow conformity to law, rather a call to studies and well thought out response to Jesus Christ and seeking to be Christ-like. Paul then goes on to warn of persons and ideas that strongly contrast with him and could be dangerous – that is altering basic beliefs so much that salvation is endangered.

I want to point to one expression that I think is so important as we “go back to work.” Paul notes that “it is God who is at work in you....” While we should all feel good about what we can accomplish by our own devices, we can never forget that God working in and through us enables us. When we come back to what we do so well because we have done it so often, it is because of the gifts and talents God built into us that we can do anything.

My challenge to you is in finding your way in this new season of labor and activity, the love of labor and joy of accomplishment as together we do the work of the Lord. And that means looking again at the basics and the ways we carry the gospel message to others. That may even be, and I hope it is, finding new and different and interesting ways of leading a gospel life wrapped in the context of whatever you do. You will meet new people and make new friends, perhaps even in the entirely new context of a new home, a new job, or retirement. But be a renewed follower of Jesus Christ, allowing others to see that in you “... for his good pleasure.”

# Fall 2010 Rummage and Bake Sale Results:

**RUMMAGE SALE RESULTS:** The **\$3135.38** proceeds from the sale will be given to support the salaries of our missionaries: (1) Larry and Jane Kies, who teach at Africa University in Zimbabwe, (2) Reed and Barbara Brock, who serve at Red Bird Missionary Conference. That makes a total of \$6003 donations for 2010 for our two supported missions.

**Not only does the sale benefit our missionaries, there are also benefits for local organizations.** Following the sale, items were given to many groups:

- 6 boxes of books to FD Public Library for their used book sale
- Boy Scout troop #9 chose items that they can use for their activities
- Youth Shelter clients chose clothing and items for their use
- 4 boxes of clothing and household items were given to Beacon of Hope, men's homeless shelter in FD
- Clothing and items were given to The Baby's Room, which is operated by Holly Scherff at Upper DM
- Bag of softballs were donated to the FDSH softball program
- The YWCA chose items for their women's shelter
- Crutches and other home health care items were given to Webster County Health for their sharing closet
- 5 boxes of "almost new" items were selected and will be given to Operation Christmas in November
- VCR tapes will be sent to missions in Alaska (under direction of 1<sup>st</sup> Covenant church)
- Boxes of clothing/puzzles/ household items were packed and taken to Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota
- The remaining items were packed and given to Goodwill

## **Bishop James S. Thomas Dies at Age 91**

Bishop James Samuel Thomas, former Bishop of the Iowa Annual Conference, died on Sunday, October 10, at age 91.

He was elected to the episcopacy by the Central Jurisdictional Conference in 1964 and was assigned to the Iowa Area and served as the Episcopal leader until 1976, when he assumed the leadership of the Ohio East Area, from which he retired in 1988. Upon his election in 1964 Bishop Thomas became the first African-American Bishop of the North Central Jurisdiction. He later served on the staff at Perkins School of Theology, was Bishop in Residence at Candler School of Theology at Emory University, and was Bishop in Residence at Clark Atlanta University.

Bishop Thomas was born into a Methodist parsonage family in Orangeburg, South Carolina. He attended Claflin College and then was a rural school principal in Florence County, South Carolina, for a year. He was ordained deacon by Bishop Lorenzo H. King and elder by Bishop Willis J. King.

While serving the Orangeburg Circuit he attended Gammon Theological Seminary and later earned an M.A. from Drew University.

Prior to his election Bishop Thomas was Associate General Secretary of the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry, with responsibility for the traditionally Black colleges. He presented the Episcopal Address at the 1976 General Conference and was President of the General Council on Finance and Administration, the Council of Bishops and the General Council on Ministries.

"In the loss of Bishop James Samuel Thomas, the church has lost a truly great leader. He was a leader and a bishop without peer," said Bishop Gregory Vaughn Palmer, former Iowa Bishop and current Episcopal leader of the Illinois Great Rivers Annual Conference. "For me he was the perfect integration of dignity, grace and passion for the gospel that anyone would want to aspire to be no matter how they were serving Jesus Christ...He will be missed dearly but there will not be a moment in the next days or weeks that will go by that his

memory and his teaching will not be evoked. I am grateful for who he was an who he will continue to be as he lives in our hearts."

In 2002, the Iowa Senate passed a resolution honoring Bishop Thomas. In its citation, the Senate extended "its thanks and congratulations to Bishop James S. Thomas and his family for their service to the United Methodist Church and to the State of Iowa, and acknowledges the work of Bishop James S Thomas for the advancement of civil rights in Iowa and in the nation."

Ruth N. Wilson and James S. Thomas were married on July 7, 1945. They have four daughters: Claudia Estelle Williamson, Gloria Jean Randle, Margaret Yvonne Glaze, and Patricia Elaine; and three granddaughters: Ramona Rug and Sarita Louis Williamson; Ashley Nicole Glaze and one grandson Christopher Michael Glaze; and one great granddaughter, Zayia Williams.

The funeral for Bishop Thomas was held on Friday, October 15, 2010 at Cascade United Methodist Church in Atlanta, Georgia.
